Unit:	Chapter:
"The Power of Storytelling"	"Crisis and Conflict"

Objective:

The student will be able to identify all aspects of the setting in the novel, define symbol, describe the setting as a symbol, name another work that uses setting as a symbol, recognize the important symbols in the novel, recognize characteristics of Bohemia, and connect those characteristics with events and characters in the story.

Procedure:

- 1. Review setting as a literary term.
- 2. Read and discuss examples of setting (of both place and time) from the novel.
- 3. Lead the discussion into setting as a symbol.
- 4. Mention how setting often becomes a symbol such as in *Titanic* or *Tarzan*.
- 5. Explain how the land becomes a symbol of Antonia herself.
- 6. Read and discuss other symbols in the novel such as the plough and the cricket.
- 7. Lead the discussion into aspects of Bohemia (Old World) compared or contrasted with America (New World).
- 8. Give some simple notes on Bohemia.
- 9. Read and discuss all examples of the Old World in the New World from the novel.
- 10. Lead the discussion into the character of Antonia.

Assessment:

Students will be tested on all objectives. They may also choose to write their reactions on the use of setting or symbol in the novel. Each reaction counts as a quiz grade.
